2021 Tree and Shrub Order Form

Conditions of Ordering:

1. Customers must order a minimum of **5 large stock trees or shrubs, or 50 seedlings**. Seedling must be purchased in **bundles of 10**.
2. Trees purchased through this order are conservation grade stock and are to be used for stewardship projects; including restoration, windbreaks, and erosion control. **These trees and shrubs should not be used for landscaping.**
3. Customers are responsible for the pick-up of trees at the County of Huron – Auburn Patrol Yard in the spring. Maitland Conservation will contact you to schedule the pick up date and time. Note: Seedling orders can be delivered within the MVCA watershed for a \$20.00 delivery fee.
4. Customers will be invoiced **after** trees have been picked up. **Prices are subject to change depending on supplier cost and availability.**
5. Maitland Conservation takes all precautions to ensure the trees are distributed in the best possible condition. **Due to environmental conditions beyond the control of Maitland Conservation, we assume no responsibility for the survival rates of the trees.**

What to Plant?

This list provides general recommendations of which species to consider while planning your project.

Please contact MVCA staff for planting advice specific to your project

	<u>Mature Height</u>	<u>Description</u>
Deciduous		
Sugar Maple	30m or 100ft	Shade tree with strong branches. Sensitive to salt.
Native Red Maple	25m or 80ft	Tolerates many soil types. Roots can affect tile drains.
Silver Maple	25m or 80ft	Tolerates wet to dry sites. Can tolerate drought.
Red & White Oak	30m or 100ft	Tolerates many soil types. Requires protection from wildlife.
Bur Oak	30m or 100ft	Tolerates many soil types. Excellent wildlife tree.
Black Walnut	30m or 100ft	Prefers well drained, fertile soil. Excellent wildlife and lumber tree.
Hackberry	18m or 60ft	Fast growing and drought tolerant. Produces berries, good for wildlife.
Tulip Tree	30m or 100ft	Prefers sandy loam soil. Large yellow or white flowers.
Sycamore	30m or 100ft	Fast growing tree. Prefers poorly drained soils.
White Birch	15m or 50ft	Grows well on poorly drained or clay sites.
Basswood	30m or 100ft	Flowers attract pollinators. Prefers moist, rich, well drained soils.
Bitternut Hickory	25m or 80ft	Prefers rich and moist soils. Produces very bitter and inedible nuts.
Conifers		
White Pine	35m or 115ft	Ontario's Provincial Tree. Best in larger reforestation areas. Sensitive to salt.
White Spruce	25m or 80ft	Excellent windbreak tree. Smaller maturity than Norway Spruce. Native species.
Norway Spruce	30m or 100ft	Excellent windbreak tree. Fast growing.
Blue Spruce	15m or 50ft	Tolerant of salt spray. Requires good drainage. Susceptible to needlecast diseases.
White Cedar	15m or 50ft	Tolerates many soil types. Great for eroded slopes.
Black Cedar	15m or 50ft	Tolerates various soil types. Cultivar of White Cedar.
Tamarack	15m or 50ft	Prefers wet, poorly drained soils. Native species.
European Larch	25m or 80ft	Salt tolerant. Excellent windbreak tree. Prefers damp soils.
Shrubs		
Pussy Willow	4.5m or 15ft	Thrives in full sun and moist soils. Food source for game and song birds.
Red-Osier Dogwood	3m or 10ft	Flowers spring to summer with white flowers. Tolerates various soil conditions.
Serviceberry	6m or 20ft	Flowers spring with white flowers. Attracts wildlife.
Staghorn Sumac	4.5m or 15ft	Grows aggressively. Prefers dry sites.
Smooth Rose	1.5m or 5ft	Prefers dry, rocky conditions. Pink flowering in spring to summer.
Elderberry	1.5m or 5ft	Produces white flowers in spring to summer. Produces fruit. Prefer fertile, moist soil.
Ninebark	6m or 10ft	Compact, drought tolerant shrub. Flowers spring to summer with white or pink flowers.
Nannyberry	4.5m or 15ft	Cream coloured. Flowers in spring. Produces fruit. Attracts wildlife.
Highbush Cranberry	4.5m or 15ft	Prefers moist soils. Produces white flower in spring, red fruit persists into winter.
