Check-out before 2:00 pm on date of departure.

NEW for 2021: Radios and audio equipment is now prohibited in the Cedar campground area or at secluded Radio Free tent campsites.

CAMPSITE OCCUPANCY

A maximum of 6 (six) people are allowed to occupy a campsite including children and babies. Refunds will not be issued if you arrive with more than 6 people per campsite. Additional campsite(s) may be required if your occupancy is greater than 6 people per campsite on arrival, pending site availability.

All campsite fees are based on single household family occupancy (2 adults and their children under 18 years). Each additional adult over 2 adults will be charged a \$5.00 nightly rate.

If COVID-19 restrictions remain in place during the camping season, only people living at the same address can camp together at a campsite, regardless of the campsite capacity.

One vehicle permit is included with your campsite registration. All other visitor vehicles checking into a campsite must purchase an **Additional Vehicle** permit at time of arrival. A maximum of 2 vehicles are allowed to park on the campsite at any time. All other visitor vehicles must park in designated parking areas. **New visitors are not permitted entry after 8:00 pm.**

CAMPSITE RESERVATIONS

To reserve a campsite, make changes or cancel your reservation; view your booking details or view site availability online at <https://maitlandvalley.goingtocamp.com> or contact the park directly at 519-524-6429 (1-877-FALLSCA) during park office hours of operation.

- All campsite reservations are subject to a \$14.00 non-refundable booking fee. 3-night minimum stay is required on holiday weekends. 2-night minimum stay is required on weekends in July and August.
- **Multiple reservations in the same name for the same time period are not permitted.**
- Once a reservation has been confirmed, any changes and cancellations are subject to applicable fees. Any change to the booking is subject to a \$10.00 administration fee. A minimum \$20.00 fee will be charged for all site cancellations. **Reservations cancelled six (6) or fewer calendar days prior to the booking arrival date will forfeit 2 nights camping or the minimum stay requirement.**
- Reservations may not be reassigned from one person to another person at time of arrival. A \$10 change fee will apply.
- Campers are considered "No Show" as of 8:00 pm on date of arrival unless arrangements have been made directly with the park for late arrival. Refunds are not issued to No Shows.

DAILY PASS FEES

- **Daily passes are admitted from 9:00 am to 6:00 pm daily.** The Conservation Area is open year round for trail use.
- Daily pass fees are not refundable (*considered an admission/parking fee*).
- Daily passes are NOT transferable.

FRCA DAILY MEMBERSHIP PASS

If you a frequent daily visitor to Falls Reserve Conservation Area, a Daily Membership Pass might be the best option for you! A Daily Membership pass allows unlimited day use entry from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm daily and is valid one year from date of purchase.

STOCKED POND FISHING PERMIT

- **Park Entry Fee Extra**
- **An Ontario Fishing Licence is required for ages 18 - 64.**
- Everyone angling in the pond requires a Pond Fishing Permit. Stocked Pond Fishing permit fees are NOT refundable or transferable.
- Pond is stocked annually with rainbow trout, has a sustainable largemouth bass population and is open for fishing during daylight hours.
- Barbless hooks are encouraged. Please do not release injured fish back to pond as it is deemed part of your catch limit.

- **Maximum of 6 household families allowed to occupy a group campsite** or at the discretion of the Park Superintendent.
- The permit holder must be 18-years of age or older. The permit holder must be present on the site.

- All vehicles checking into a group campsite must have a valid permit, issued at check-in to the park. Group vehicles are permitted to park on designated group campsite area.
- Group site fees paid in full at time of booking. 3-night minimum stay is required on holiday weekends. 2-night minimum stay is required on all weekends in July and August.
- Once a reservation has been confirmed, any changes and cancellations are subject to applicable fees. Any change to the booking is subject to a \$10.00 administration fee. A minimum \$20.00 fee will be charged for all site cancellations. **Reservations cancelled six (6) or fewer calendar days prior to the booking arrival date will forfeit 2 nights camping or the minimum stay requirement.**
- Campers are considered "No Show" as of 8:00 pm on date of arrival unless arrangements have been made directly with the park for late arrival. Refunds are not issued to No Shows.

INFORMATION THAT PARK GUESTS NEED TO KNOW

DOGS IN THE CONSERVATION AREA

- Dogs are welcomed pets at your campsite or in the Conservation Area. All pets are to be leashed and under control at all times while in the Conservation Area or at the campsite.
- Dogs disturbing other campers, such as nuisance barking will be evicted from the Conservation Area. A maximum of 2 dogs are allowed per campsite. As a pet owner, it is your responsibility to ensure you know the rules around pets in the Conservation Area and ensure compliance to these rules.

Rules about pets in the Conservation Area

- All pets are to be secured by a minimum 2-metre leash at all times in the Conservation Area.
- No person shall allow their dog to bark excessively or allow their pet to disturb other persons in the Conservation Area.
- There is a maximum of 2-dogs allowed per campsite to prevent excessive barking habits.
- Pets shall not be left unattended at any time, either at the campsite, in a vehicle/trailer/tent or other area of the Conservation Area.
- Pets are not allowed in park buildings including washroom or shower facilities.
- Always stoop and scoop and dispose of pet waste appropriately. Do not hang pet waste bags in trees or leave along trail side.

CAMPSITE AMENITIES / ACCEPTABLE GEAR and EQUIPMENT

- All campsites include one picnic table and designated fire pit.
- Serviced campsites include one electrical service connection and one water hook-up connection.
- One vehicle permit is included with your campsite registration. All other visitor vehicles checking into a campsite must purchase an **Additional Vehicle** permit at time of arrival.
- A **maximum of 2 vehicles are allowed to park on the campsite at any time**. All other visitor vehicles must park in designated parking areas. **New visitors are not permitted entry after 8:00 pm**.
- You are **allowed up to 3 pieces of sheltered equipment** on your campsite if space permits (including a dining tent/tarp). Only one piece of sheltered camping equipment may be: a tent trailer, travel trailer, house trailer, motor home, camper van or self-propelled camping unit.

ARRIVING AT THE CONSERVATION AREA

- When you visit, continue to follow public health advice including physical distancing by keeping at least two metres from others, wearing a face covering where required and when physical distancing may be challenging or not possible, washing hands regularly with soap and water or use alcohol-based hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available. Avoid large groups and respect posted closures for both your safety and for the safety of others.

- A reservation is NOT your camp permit. All campers are to park ahead of the gatehouse upon arrival and check-in with Park Staff to obtain your camp permit. If no Park Staff is at gatehouse, arriving campers are to proceed to your campsite and Park Staff will assist you at a later time.
- **Campsite reservations are booked based on nightly campsite accommodation from 3:00 pm to 2:00 pm the following day.** Early arrivals and late departure are subject to additional fees.
- **Campsite check-in is after 3:00 pm on date of arrival. Campsite check-out is before 2:00 pm on date of departure.**
- Arriving prior to 8:00 pm to set up your campsite is appreciated. Noise from setting up a campsite disturbs other campers during quiet times. If late arrival is necessary, please set up quickly and keep noise to a minimum.

RENEWING AND VACATING YOUR CAMPSITE

- Campsite renewal is before 12:00 pm (noon). After 12:00 pm (noon), all sites schedule to leave or that have not been renewed will be available to new campers.
- Check-out time for campsite is by 2:00 pm
- A site may be renewed subject to availability.
- **Campers are responsible for cleaning up and removing all garbage and unwanted belongings from the campsite before departure.**

SHORTENING YOUR STAY

- Many factors are considered when campers make a choice to shorten their stay. Some of these reasons are beyond the control of park operations. Shortening your stay has financial implications on the operations of the park and may limit opportunities for other visitors to camp or extend their stay.
- **No Refund** for shortening your stay on holiday weekends or on minimum stay requirements.
 - **No Refunds** on issued Additional Vehicle permits. Additional Vehicle permits are not transferable.
 - **No Refunds** on terminated permits due to park eviction.
 - **No Refunds** due to inclement weather or insect pests.
 - **No Refunds** of any sort will be approved through park or gatehouse staff other than refunds in-line with reservation, cancellation or change policies.
 - **NO CASH REFUNDS**

Refunds require approval by the Park Superintendent and may take up to 30 days to process.

GENERAL RULES WHILE VISITING THE CONSERVATION AREA

- **Park quiet time is from 10:00 pm to 8:00 am. Radios or audio equipment are prohibited during quiet times.** Please remember that loud voices may disturb other campers. Please be considerate of others during quiet times.
- **Radios and audio equipment is now prohibited in the Cedar campground area and at secluded Radio Free tent campsites.**
- **Be considerate of other campers; respect the rules of the Conservation Area.** Excessive noise and/or behaviour that may disturb other persons is prohibited.

- **Abusive or insulting language towards park staff or other persons is NOT tolerated and will result in termination of permit and eviction from the property.**
- **Alcoholic Beverages** - may be consumed “responsibly” at the campsite ONLY; alcohol is prohibited in all other areas of the Conservation Area including all pavilions and all day use areas.
- **Cannabis** - the use of cannabis shall not interfere with the enjoyment of other campers at the Conservation Area. Respect and consideration of others is encouraged. Anyone knowingly or unknowingly disturbing others with the use of cannabis will be asked to take all measures to prevent this disturbance. Anyone NOT willing to comply with this reasonable responsibility will be asked to leave the Conservation Area.
- Anyone observed operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol or cannabis in the Conservation Area will be reported to the Police.
- **Illegal Narcotics and Drugs** - the use of illegal narcotics or illegal drugs within the Conservation Area is strictly prohibited. Anyone observed using, soliciting, selling or offering of illegal narcotics or illegal drugs within the Conservation Area will be reported to the Police.
- **Firewood - buy locally, burn on site. Pests in firewood can destroy forests.** Please ensure the firewood you are bringing into the park does not contain invasive insects or diseases. Bagged firewood is available and sold at the park Gatehouse.
- **Removal of dead or live wood from natural areas within the Conservation Area for use as campfire wood is prohibited.** A charge of \$125.00 will be applied to the campsite permit holder if wood from bush or adjacent site area is used to fuel campfire.
- **Garbage and cleanliness of campsite** - it is the responsibility of the permit holder to keep the campsite clean and litter free at all times. Scattered litter is unacceptable and may result in termination of campsite permit. Garbage left on the campsite overnight will attract unwanted wildlife pests including racoons and skunks. Campers must dispose of campsite waste at the Garbage and Recycling Centre nightly. A charge of \$125.00 will be applied to the campsite permit holder’s account if garbage is left on a campsite upon departure. Campers are also encouraged to separate recyclables from trash waste and place in the proper waste bin provided. Hazardous waste items are not accepted at the Conservation Area

CAMPER CONDUCT

There is one basic rule in the Conservation Area: **Have respect and consideration for your fellow visitors and the park environment.** Under the Conservation Authorities Act, the permit holder is responsible for the conduct of all campsite occupants and could be charged with an offence or immediately evicted from the park based on the actions of the occupants on the registered campsite. The Conservation Authorities Act and other legislation governing behaviour can be reviewed at the conservation area office, our website www.mvca.on.ca, and on the e-laws website

at www.e-laws.gov.on.ca. These laws are enforced by the Conservation Area Park Officers and staff who have the power and the authority to charge or evict any person(s) from the park property whom are found in violation of an offence or park rule.

Many of the listed offences or park rules could result in eviction from the conservation area. Evicted visitors will not receive a refund and are prohibited from the property for a period up to 3 years.

ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY

Falls Reserve Conservation Area has a Zero Tolerance Policy towards verbal or physical abuse of staff or other park visitors. **Anyone using verbal or physical abuse towards park staff will not be given or provided service, issued a permit to access the park, or will be asked to leave the park property without question. If police assistance is needed, charges may be laid.**

NO REFUNDS available at any time as a result of persons being disrespectful or that present verbal or physical abuse towards staff.

Your camping privileges may be revoked anytime without refund at the discretion of the Superintendent or designate. At any such occurrence those in violation shall leave the property immediately without question.
